Teton County, Wyoming – The Teton County Weed and Pest District announces the update of the Teton County Declared and State Designated Noxious Weed Lists for 2008.

Each year in conjunction with the Wyoming Department of Agriculture and the Wyoming Weed and Pest Council, the District reviews and updates the list of noxious weeds for Teton County and the State of Wyoming. These species are listed because of their detrimental, destructive, injurious, or poisonous effects. All landowners and land managers should be aware that control of these species is required by Wyoming State Law. The District has many programs and cost share opportunities available to assist with management of these species.
